When are Pesticide Applicators Required to be Licensed?

- Pesticide Applications Made For Hire
- Public Employees
- Daycare Employees
- School Employees
- College Employees
- Hospital Employees
- Food Establishment Employees
- Golf Course Employees
 - And...

Attention Apartment/Rental Owners & Managers

Owners and employees of rental properties with more than 4 apartment units at one location are required to be licensed as Commercial Applicators in order to apply pesticides at those properties

Direct Supervision

- Non-Licensed Employee of Same Employer
- Trained Serviceperson Requirement
- Acting Under the Instructions and Control
- Located in Close Proximity
 - -The Farther of 25 Miles or 2 Hours
 - With a Copy of Pesticide Label in the Absence of the Licensee

Exchange of Information

If requested after a pesticide application, Pesticide Applicators shall provide to each customer and resident of the applied property, a legibly written statement of the pesticide applied, the amount applied and the date of application

8 Basic Record Requirements

- Name of commercial applicator & trained serviceperson
- Name and address of client
- 3) Date of application
- Pests to be controlled

- 5) Location & method of treatment for each pesticide used
- 6) Pesticide name & EPA Registration #
- 7) Application concentration or dilution & total volume
- 8) Start and stop times

Pesticide Business License

- No person shall own or operate a pesticide business without obtaining a license from the director of agriculture.
- Pesticide Businesses must have insurance that covers their use of pesticides.

Pesticide Enforcement

- Voluntary Compliance
 - Department wideGoal
 - Education and ComplianceAssistance



Enforcement Options

- Criminal Prosecution
- Court Ordered Injunction
- License Revocation
- Civil Penalty
- Notice of Warning
- Field Notice of Warning

Common Bedbug Complaints

- Pesticide Misuse
- Non Licensed Applicators
- Unable to Gain Control
- Human Exposure

Prohibited Acts

ORC 921.24(A) No person shall apply, use, directly supervise such application or use, or recommend a pesticide for use inconsistent with the pesticide's labeling

Pesticide Labeling

- Pay Attention to Label Restrictions
- Re-Entry Restrictions
- Re-Treatment Restrictions
- Dilution Requirements
- General Information vs. Specific Site Labeling

Investigation Summary


Case Scenario:

- Friday @ 10:00 a.m. Tenant from duplex called to complain about excessive treatment for bedbugs using Malathion
- Inspector was immediately put in route to duplex because the applicator was to return for a second treatment in the afternoon

Additional Information

- After the 1st treatment the applicator told the tenant that he would have to kill him if he told him what he was applying
- This was the 3rd day in a row of 5 contracted days for treatment with 2 treatments each day

Misuse — Cincinnati Malathion

- Repeated treatment with Malathion inconsistent with label use – not labeled for indoor use
- Non-Licensed Business & Applicator
- Human Health Issues
- Criminal Conviction by ODA
- USEPA Decontamination Study

Case Scenario

- Bank was being preventatively treated for bedbugs as 2 employees allegedly had them at home...
- Treatment was being completed as employees were reporting for work and there was a very strong chemical odor
- Employees started having breathing issues and felt ill and the bank closed for several days

Labeled directions for use stated "Do not apply as a broadcast spray indoors" and "On furniture, do not apply to seating areas, arms or other areas where direct skin contact can occur"



Case Summary

 Video showed broadcast application to entire floor and all seating surfaces

\$5,000 civil penalty issued by ODA

Misuse – Sevin Dust

Grandparents used Sevin Dust to treat bedbugs ... "it worked for someone else"

Two disabled uncles also living in the home





Clean up procedures?

Probably not applied according to the Directions for Use

Pesticide Distribution Concerns

- No person shall distribute a misbranded pesticide
- Distribute means to provide the pesticide to another person
- A pesticide is Misbranded if it's label does not include all Federally required information
- Only registered pesticide producing establishments can produce pesticides

Major Distribution Concern

Tenants often left pesticide product to use after the owner or owner's employee makes a pesticide application

Is this Misbranded?
